

Donations or Short-term loans Interest Free

The Trustees have felt directed for some time to broaden into other ministries associated with debt. e.g. budget advisory, counselling and teaching, and assistance with finance in emergencies. At the same time we are limited in what we can do to almost zero, because it is important that every dollar contributed to the Mortgage Fund is used for that purpose. None is used for expenses of the Fund or any other ministry of Liberty Trust. As a result we cannot broaden our ministries, or even buy a computer or computer programs, teaching equipment, etc.

Covenant Homes Ltd., a builder of homes throughout the Bay of Plenty, the Waikato and Auckland, and even in Japan, and winner of most awards for this area in the recent Master Builder Federation competition, has generously offered to build homes for us at cost, in order to help us to raise funds. In order to do this we need seed money to buy sections. They will design the homes which will be pre-sold. Payments received will cover costs as the houses are built.

We already have been lent \$13,000 until November. Are you able to help us by planting a seed, as a donation or interest-free loan?

Flexibility for Members too

Present contributors may now change their loan application, which until recently was set at \$70,000. Those in the Pioneer Group who wish to increase will need to pay back-contributions since they began, up to the new rates. To retain their sequence order, all others must do the same. However if you haven't got the money we can move your sequence order instead. The size of the loan must be changed before you are balloted. Ask us for details.

What is the Real Cost of Liberty Trust?

The new contribution rates of \$10 per week per \$25,000, provide a good opportunity for

comparison with the cost of a mortgage.



Assume you require \$25,000 (or multiples of). If you wait the average of 8 years and repay in 8 years you will contribute for 16 years X 52 weeks X \$10 = \$8,320 Or for a worst-case

maximum of 10 years and repay in 10 years = \$10,400 - You contribute between 33% and 42% of the amount borrowed.

However if you borrow from a bank at 10%:
Repayments over 20 years = Interest of \$32,901
Or over 25 years = Interest of \$43,152
which is 132% and 173%

Result: You pay 4 times as much on a bank mortgage.

i.e. a saving of between \$90,000 and \$140,000 in interest on a mortgage of \$100,000.
