

This month signals Liberty Trust's 15th birthday! We've come a long way from our humble beginnings birthed in prayer in 1988. An intercessor saw the burden bank mortgages and interest rates were inflicting on the financial liberty of God's people. As interest rates rose, giving slowed, and church ministries were suffering. God revealed to her the answer was to come through people pooling their resources and taking turns to pay off each other's mortgages. He warned many would not be ready but instructed she should take the vision to her pastor who would put it into operation.

After a year of prayer and research Liberty Trust was opened to the pioneers who each pledged to give \$20 per week to the Liberty Trust storehouse. Three years later we opened up our doors to further members, then later, more flexible amounts. Now after 15 years these pioneers and 50 newer members have been offered interest free loans, and we have raised almost \$3 million, bringing liberty to God's people.

The Selfish Generation

Demographers also tell us that today's baby boomers are retiring relatively wealthy. They are the investors who are driving up prices and rents. For their retirement they are building new luxury homes and pushing up the price of coastal properties world-wide. Yet many are too self-centred to help their children toward buying homes.

The Purposeless Generation

Because of rising rents and prices, compounded by student debt, children of the baby boomer's are finding it increasingly difficult to purchase a home. Many despair of ever saving a deposit for a home and choose instead to spending their money on luxuries such as home theatres, and vacations, simply giving up the goal of home ownership. Proverbs 29 verse 18 says "Without a vision the people dwell carelessly" (AV). Isn't this exactly what is happening to this generation! And these are the ones who will likely retire without savings or superannuation.

The Answer

These should learn first of all to put their religion into practice by caring for their own family... If anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. (1 Tim 4:4b,8 NIV)

A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children. (Prov 13:22a NIV)

Liberty Trust provides the perfect answer for parents and grandparents. By starting their family in Liberty Trust, they enable their children to obtain their home interest free, while they contribute to God's Kingdom and build resources for future generations.

Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it. (Pr 22:6 NIV)

We must train as we assist so that our family can apply God's financial principles to their own lives and be responsible stewards of God's resources.

Even \$20 per week into Liberty Trust is enough to give hope to build on. Build a heritage for future generations; help your children into their first home, just as they did in Bible times.
